In Person – PERC Room at LEE High School

President, David Zimkowski, began the meeting at 7:02pm.

1. Introductions/Welcome:

- a. Everyone present introduced themselves and shared what major their child was a member of at NESA. We had parents representing Musical Theater, Dance, Visual Art, Creative Writing, Cinema and Technical Theater. Our membership goal is 90% for the year.
- b. Some parents did not receive the email from pArtners sent out. Anyone not receiving the emails was asked to get with Angie Ogawa, in charge of membership, at end of meeting.

2. Volunteer opportunities:

- a. Must sign up and complete background check through NEISD to be a volunteer.
- b. Most help needed now is with the MT show meals. We need parents to help pickup the meals, fruits and snacks that will be served. c. Help is needed at concessions during NESA events. An email will be sent out next week with sign-up information to volunteer at upcoming events.

3. Fundraiser opportunities:

- a. Biggest fundraiser is concessions held during events at NESA.
- b. We will be having a silent auction in December during the Steppin Into the Holidays dance show. Looking at having it during the Saturday night show. The plan is to have each major create a basket to be auctioned. Krystal Pounds, Joann Moreno and Garth Dennis volunteered to be on the Silent Auction committee.

4. Treasurer Report: Budget Presented and accepted

- a. Recap as of October 11, 2022: Income \$9,022.48 less Expenses of \$1,573.17 leaving Net Income of \$7,449.31
- b. Donations: Anyone can donate by going to NESA pARTners website.

We are also listed on Amazon Smile as organization that can be selected.

5. Senior Scholarship/SAEF Scholarship

- a. Family must be a member of NESAs pARTners to be eligible, as it is a pARTner scholarship, not an academic/NEISD scholarship
- b. SAEF scholarship Fall and Spring
- c. Senior must have at least 12 volunteer hours during the academic senior year to be eligible, either at NESAs events or other volunteer organization

6. Teacher Wishlist

- a. Goal is to fund \$1,400 to each teacher for items on their wish list.

7. Upcoming Events

- a. Burger Boy (281/Bitters) Fundraiser next Wednesday, October 19th from 5 to 9pm. We receive 15% of total sales for the night. We are asking for students and parents to wear their NESAs shirts and show their spirit at the restaurant. NESAs pARTners will be signing off on service hours for students who show up in NESAs shirts or make posters to advertise and promote the fundraiser that night.
- b. Little Mermaid Nov 4,5,6,11,12,13 – email will be sent out to sign up to help with show meals, concessions, backstage and backstage supplies (water/snacks)
- c. NESAs Banquet will be held May 25th. Banquet will be held at UIW Skyroom. Tickets will be available for purchase to all NESAs students and senior parents.

8. Q and A

- a. Responsibilities of Chair Duties:
 - i. Liaison between teacher and pARTners to communicate volunteers or supplies needed for any upcoming events.
 - ii. Help with teacher wish lists and end of year teacher gifts.
- b. Question was asked about show meal costs:
 - i. We try to keep cost between \$8 and \$10 per meal
- c. Question was asked about adding baked goods to concessions and having a hearty meal option on Friday night events. We are open to

this possibility, since this is a NESa pARTners fundraiser, the vendor does not have to be NEISD approved.

d. Question was asked about hosting a Trunk or Treat for the kids on Saturday, Oct 29th or Monday, October 31st. Another suggestion was making treat bags for the kids and distributing them with their show meals on the 31st. David will reach out to Ms. Bryant for approval.

1. Introductions/Welcome

4. Senior Scholarship/SAEF Scholarship recap presented by Jules Aldaz Guerra

- a. Scholarships are to be used to attend camps, auditions or any enrichment programs
- b. Family must be a member of NESApARTners to be eligible, as it is a pARTner scholarship, not an academic/NEISD scholarship
- c. Senior must have at least 12 volunteer hours during the academic senior year to be eligible, either at NESA events or other volunteer organization
- d. SAEF scholarships for Fall and Spring:
 - i. Fall scholarships are open to all grade level students to be used for camps, auditions, or enrichment programs by January 31, 2023
 - ii. Spring scholarships are only open to freshmen, sophomores, and juniors
 - iii. SAEF scholarships will be announced on November 14th
 - iv. Application is due by November 18th
 - v. Essay must be submitted by November 28th
 - vi. Scholarships range between \$200 and \$500; not a cap on how many are awarded

5. Membership committee/Fundraising

- a. Basket planning - Stephanie/Crystal recap
 - i. Instrumental Music still needs a parent to organize the basket for that major
 - ii. Lead parent for each major will be sending out a letter asking for donations from parents and coordinating collection of donations
 - iii. All donations for baskets are due November 29th
 - iv. Basket Silent Auction will be held during Steppin into the Holidays dance show on Saturday, December 3rd
 - v. Basket with highest bid will earn that major an additional \$500 for them to use
- b. Possible future on site fundraiser with Kendra Scott – organization would receive 20% of sales
- c. Concessions - Stephanie recapped needs for upcoming shows i. Record high of concession sales set last Sunday during Little Mermaid Show
 - ii. Joe at Earle Abel's donated cookies for Little Mermaid Show; pARTners is planning on purchasing more cookies for upcoming shows
- d. Goal is to have concessions open during all NESAs events

- c. Question was asked about selling flower bouquets at shows – in the past this turned out to be a break even event versus an actual fundraising event; Crystal will research if there is a way to make a

profit in the future
