Angie Ogawa reported that membership is still at 108 members

David Zimkowski reported that Banquet sales were opening tonight via the new Square application. Banquet is May 25th at University of Incarnate Word Skyroom. Senior parents may attend with their student; underclassmen parents may only be present if they're volunteering. Tickets are \$40 and an optional t-shirt may be purchased for \$8.

Crystal reported that Volunteer signups for Banquet will be sent out this week. Emphasis was placed on the "No In & Out Rule" for Banquet attendees.

Crystal reported that Fundraising ideas would be developed this summer and welcomed assistance. Casino Night, Mister Soft Truck, Silent Auction at Steppin', Spirit Nights, Kendra Scott are all under consideration.

Lisa reported that Revenues are \$39K and Expenditures at \$37K. Banquet income and expenses, and Concession income are the only remaining major transactions expected. In previous years, too much money was carried over, so we are planning for a net "loss" this year to reduce our carry over in accordance with our non-profit status.

- b. Family must be a member of NESApARTners to be eligible, as it is a pARTner scholarship, not an academic/NEISD scholarship
- c. Senior must have at least 12 volunteer hours during the academic senior year to be eligible, either at NESA events or other volunteer organization
- d. SAEF scholarships for Fall and Spring:
 - i. Fall scholarships are open to all grade level students to be used for camps, auditions, or enrichment programs by January 31, 2023
 - ii. Spring scholarships are only open to freshmen, sophomores, and juniors
 - iii. SAEF scholarships will be announced on November 14th
 - iv. Application is due by November 18th
 - v. Essay must be submitted by November 28th
 - vi. Scholarships range between \$200 and \$500; not a cap on how many are awarded
